FELT INSTRUCTIONS



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YOU WILL NEED:

- BROWN AND GREEN FELT
- BROWN THREAD
- WADDING / STUFFING

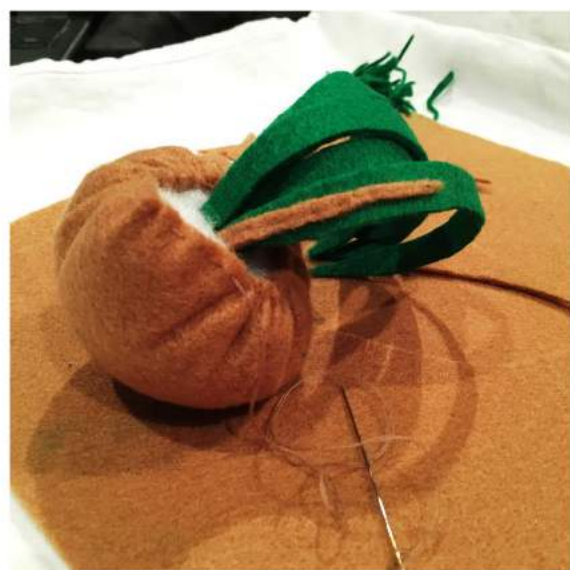
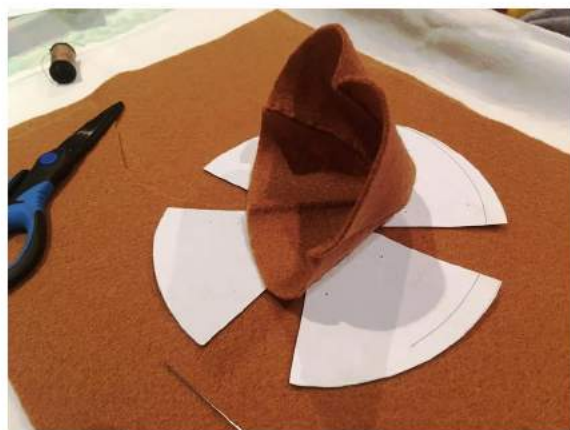
INSTRUCTIONS (MAKES 1 ONION)

1. CUT OUT THE TEMPLATE IN BROWN FELT (SAVING THE TRIMMINGS FOR THE LEAVES)
2. SEW THE STRAIGHT EDGES TOGETHER WITH THE BROWN THREAD (A COUPLE OF MM FROM THE EDGE)
3. TURN THE RESULTING SHAPE INSIDE-OUT
4. SEW A LOOSE RUNNING STITCH ALONG THE OPEN EDGE OF THE ONION BULB SHAPE, AND FILL WITH STUFFING / WADDING
5. CREATE LEAFY STALKS FOR YOUR ONION BY CUTTING LONG STRIPS OF GREEN FELT, BETWEEN 14-17CM, AND TRIM THE EDGES TO RESEMBLE ONION LEAF STEMS
6. ADD THINNER STRIPS OF LEFTOVER BROWN FELT TO BOTTOMS OF GREEN LEAF STRIPS (SEE PICTURE)
7. SEW THE BOTTOMS OF ALL LEAF STRIPS TOGETHER, WITH BROWN STRIP EDGES ON THE OUTSIDE
8. STICK THE BOTTOM OF THE LEAF STALKS INTO THE TOP OF THE STUFFING
9. PULL THE RUNNING STITCH TIGHT AT THE TOP OF THE ONION, KEEPING THE STUFFING AND LEAF STALKS INSIDE
10. SEW THE TOP CLOSED, ENSURING THE GREEN LEAF STALKS ARE SECURED
